KidsInclusive – Kingston Health Sciences Centre is the Coordinating Agency for Lanark, Leeds & Grenville and Kingston, Frontenac, Lennox & Addington. The Special Needs Steering Committee for both of the service delivery areas meets monthly and continues to oversee the development and implementation of our local work.

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Where are we in the process of implementation for Coordinated Service Planning (CSP)?

The Service Planning Coordinator position will be located at Developmental Services of Leeds & Grenville and Lanark Community Programs. This is currently in process.

Eligibility for Coordinated Service Planning

The LLG Special Needs Steering Committee is working with KidsInclusive and the Kingston, Frontenac, Lennox & Addington Special Needs Steering Committee to develop the tools and processes for eligibility and intake so we have consistent practices across both service delivery areas. Once these are in place, this will be communicated back to all partners.



Community of Practice

Community of Practice (CoP) working groups have been identified as an integral component for embedding Coordinated Service Planning in the work of the agencies, services and supports working with children and youth with multiple and/or complex special needs and their families. They help to change practices and support continuous quality improvement. LLG's Coordinated Service Planning Community of Practice is meeting monthly in January, February and March, and will be meeting quarterly thereafter. There is currently representation from KidsInclusive; Developmental Services of Leeds & Grenville; Lanark Community Programs; Brockville and District Association for Community Involvement; South East Local Health Integration Network; Upper Canada District School Board; Catholic School Board of Eastern Ontario; Language Express; Family Members; Children's Mental Health of Leeds & Grenville; Infant Child Development Program; Ottawa-Carleton Children's Treatment Centre / Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario and Conseil des écoles catholiques du Centre-Est.
